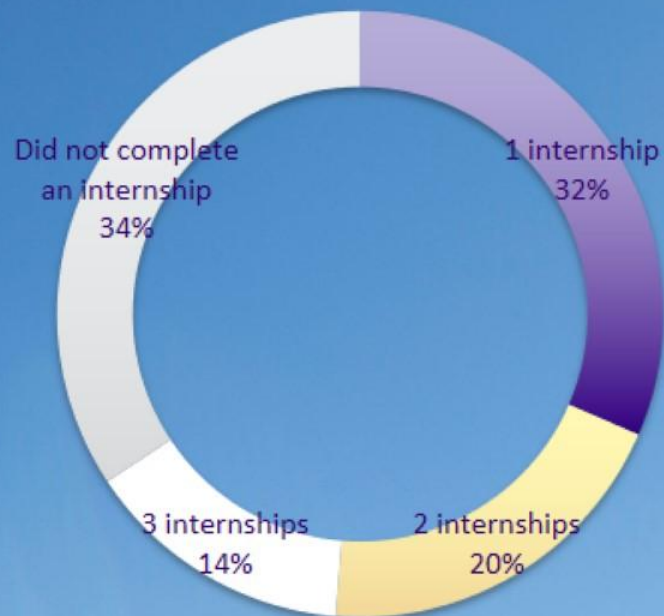

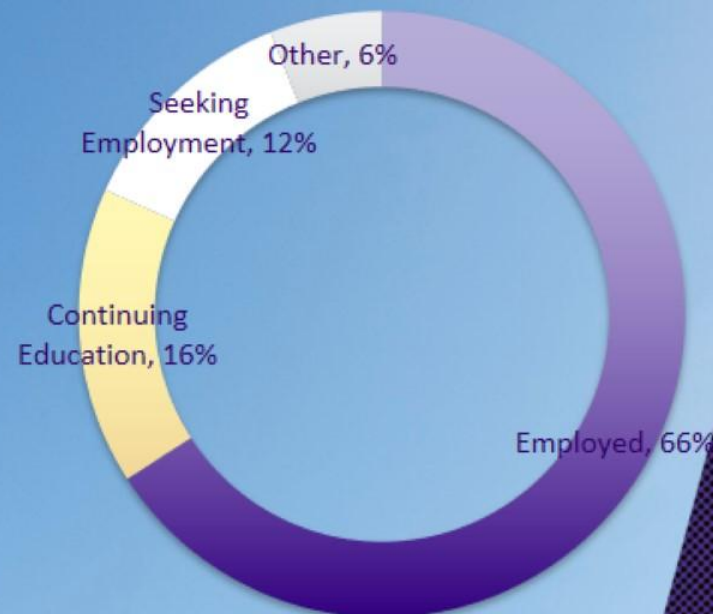
INTERNSHIP & CAREER

Next Destination (6 months after)

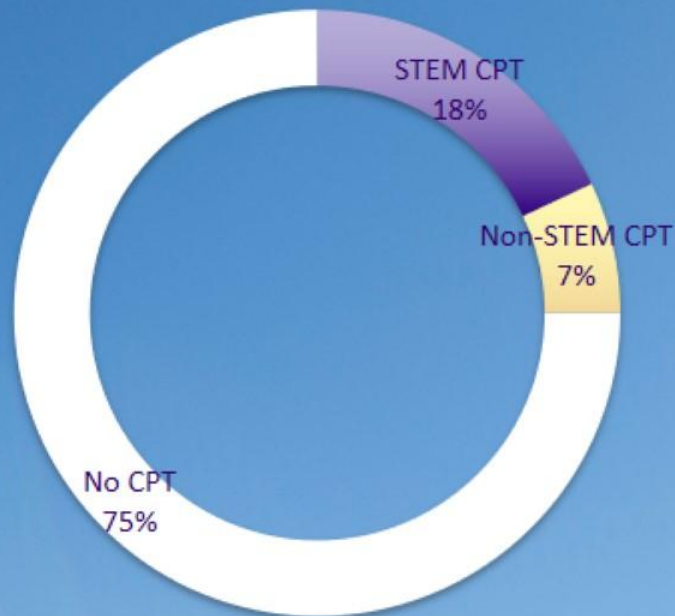

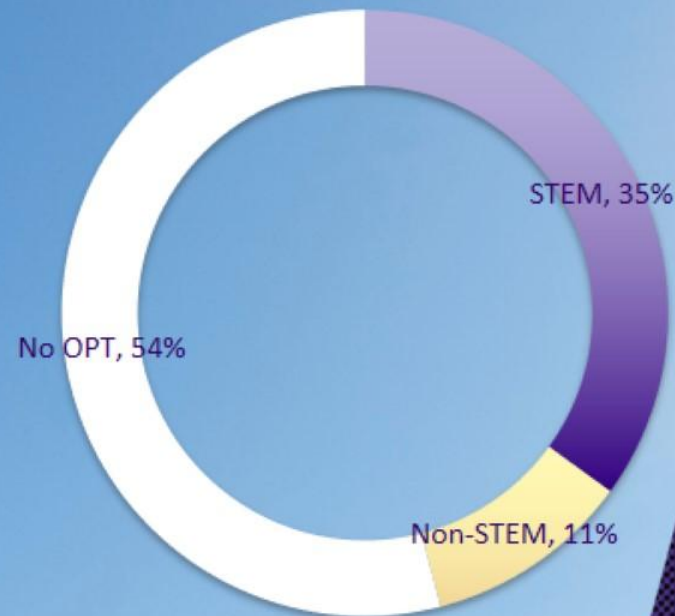

- > ACADEMIC PREPARATION & PERFORMANCE**
- > PERSONAL ACHIEVEMENTS & CHARACTERISTICS**

US citizen/permanent residents

SAT/ACT is optional

- **No score or low score will not impact your application negatively**
- **High test scores may be considered**
 - **SAT: 1400 or above**
 - **ACT: 31 or above**

Deadline to take the test: December 31, 2021



English Proficiency Requirement for International Students

	TOEFL (IBT)	IELTS	Duolingo*
Minimum score required	76	6.0	105
Recommended score	92	7.0	N/A

Students may submit SAT or ACT instead of TOEFL/IETLS/Duolingo if:

- English was the primary language of instruction of their high school AND
- They received a minimum average grade of B in 10 & 11th grade English composition courses AND
- They have a minimum SAT Evidence-Based Reading and Writing score of 580 or ACT English score of 22.
