English Proficiency

(international students only)

- International students requiring a visa to study in the U.S. are required to submit an English proficiency exam that meets the UW minimum admission requirement. English proficiency is considered in the holistic review.
- Exams must be taken on or before December 31, 2022.

Minimum score required	76	6.0	105
Recommended score	92 or higher	7.0 or higher	120 or higher
